### Narrative

Based on a complaint we received that Golie's Casino was allowing people under the age of 18 to gamble (see case report 2004-01532), it was decided to contact the Liquor Control Board and attempt to perform a joint compliance inspection with them in regards to under age gambling and serving of liquor.

I called Senior Liquor Agent Kate MIYASATO. She said they would be more than willing to work with us on this. I explained what we were trying to do and that we would need a person under the age of 18 to check the gambling. She said they have several people they use, but since school just started up she would have to check to see who was available. She said she would do some checking and give me a call early next week. She said Shoreline, Mt. Lake Terrace, and Everett would work well. We set up a meeting for Monday the 20th at 1300 here at the Everett Office. I informed THOMAS of it and requested he start the process of getting a check for the UC funds to do the inspections.

On 9/20/04 THOMAS and I met with MIYASATO. We discussed the situation with her and devised a plan that would work for both of our agencies. She said she had not been able to confirm with any of their underage people yet, but would let me know by the 23rd. We tentatively planned on proceeding and meeting at this office on Friday 24th to prepare. MIYASATO later called to inform me she had one person confirm for sure on Friday who was under 18. She said he and the two LCB agents would meet us at the Everett office at 1630 on 9/24/04.

On 9/24/04 SA Amy SCHMITT and I met with two agents from the LCB and their underage student, who had just recently turned 16, here at the Everett office and discussed our plan of action. It was decided we would first send in one of the LCB agents undercover to find a suitable blackjack table. The sixteen year old would then enter the casino, sit at the same table, and attempt to gamble. Each of them would be given \$20 to gamble with. After that, the 16 year old would go over to the bar and attempt to purchase alcohol. If he was successful, the second LCB agent would step in and take control of the alcohol. One of them would come out and signal us. SA SCHMITT would then enter and issue the NOVAS's to the casino and dealer, while I went and secured the video tapes and took them into evidence. The sixteen year old would then fill out his report in the car with one of the LCB agents.

Since the 16 year old had not played blackjack before, I gave him a quick crash course on the basics and played some hands with him. I told him not to worry about winning or losing, as he was only going to be given \$20 and it probably would not last very long. We told him to play four to six hands, depending whether or not he won any, and then get up and go to the bar.

We went out to seven casinos, including Goldie's, to complete compliance inspections. Here are the results:

- 1) Great American Casino in Everett - 16 year old was not allowed to enter the casino by staff as he was not old enough. Checked his ID at the door. There is only one entrance to the casino.
- 2) Silver Dollar MLT - 16 year was allowed to gamble at a BJ table, was able to purchase a bottle of beer, and walk out of the casino with it. See AT04 for the minor's statement. We issued a NOVAS to the dealer and the casino; and the LCB issued a criminal citation to the server and is filing an administrative case against the casino. Surveillance tapes were taken into evidence (AT01). See case report numbers 2004-001877 and 2004-01876.
- 3) Crazy Moose in MLT - 16 year was allowed to gamble at a Spanish 21 table, was able to purchase a bottle of beer, and walk out of the casino with it. See AT05 for the minor's statement. We issued a NOVAS to the dealer and the

casino; and the LCB issued a criminal citation to the server and is filing an administrative case against the casino. Surveillance tapes were taken into evidence (AT02). See case report numbers 2004-01879 and 2004-01878.

4) Goldie's Casino in Shoreline - 16 year old was not allowed to enter the casino by staff as he was not old enough. Checked his ID at the door. Since there are two entrances to the casino, we had him try the other door. The result was the same.

5) Club Hollywood in Shoreline - 16 year old was not allowed to enter the casino by staff as he was not old enough. Checked his ID at the door. Since there are two entrances to the casino, we had him try the other door. The result was the same.

6) Drift on In in Shoreline - 16 year old was not allowed to enter the casino by staff as he was not old enough. Checked his ID at the door. Since there are two entrances to the casino, we had him try the other door. The result was the same.

7) Parker's in Shoreline - 16 year was allowed to gamble at a Spanish 21 table, was able to purchase a bottle of beer, and walk out of the casino with it. See AT06 for the minor's statement. We issued a NOVAS to the dealer and the casino; and the LCB issued a criminal citation to the server and is filing an administrative case against the casino. Surveillance tapes were taken into evidence (AT03). See case report numbers 2004-01881 and 2004-01880.

Agents later called the four casinos that did not let the 16 year old enter to gamble or buy alcohol to let them them know their staff was doing a good job and to keep up the good work.

A copy of the A19 and money order for the issuance of \$500 to be used in the inspections and the return of \$450 at the completion of the inspections are included in AT07.
